

Supporting Ukrainians and Ukrainian organisations through Erasmus+

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Since 2022, Erasmus+ has been mobilised at an unprecedented scale to support the response to Russia's war of aggression against Ukraine. More than € 208 million has helped displaced learners continue their education and has strengthened cooperation, mobility, and resilience across the education, training, youth, and sport sectors.

Mobility projects:

- Since 2022, over **51 600 Ukrainians** have studied, trained, or taught abroad through Erasmus+ mobility projects (**€ 129 million**).
- Nearly 35,000 of these were able to start their mobility directly from Ukraine (**€ 98 million**).

Cooperation projects:

- Since 2023, Erasmus+ has included a specific priority to support projects addressing the consequences of Russia's war of aggression against Ukraine. So far, **259 projects** have been supported (**€ 48 million**).
- In addition, **115 capacity building projects** in higher education, vocational education and training, youth and sport involve Ukrainian organisations, helping institutions modernise, adapt and recover (**€ 22 million**).

Additional support:

- A further **€ 9 million** supports Ukrainian organisations through policy cooperation and teaching activities on European Union topics.
- Erasmus+ has also funded printing and distribution of **1.5 million school textbooks**, helping children in Ukraine continue learning despite the war.

Looking ahead, Ukraine will remain a priority under Erasmus+. The programme will continue to support learning mobility and cooperation across the education, training, youth, and sport sectors, helping Ukrainian learners continue their education, strengthening institutions, and keeping Ukraine closely connected to the European education community.
